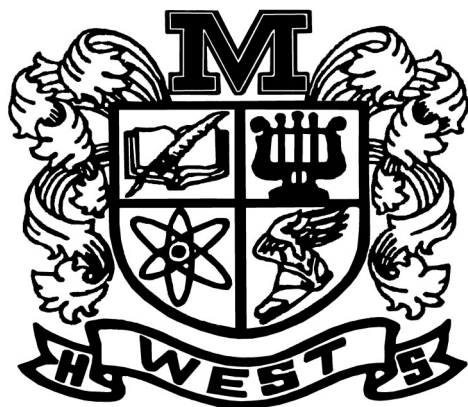

District Information:

The Millard Public School District is located in the southwest area of Omaha, Nebraska. This predominantly suburban, residential district serves over 24,000 students, includes twenty-five elementary schools, six middle schools and four high schools. The Millard School District has the reputation of being among the finest school districts in the state and nation. Students consistently score well on national standardized tests. Over 90% of Millard West graduates go on to higher education. The district has AA Accreditation, the highest recognition awarded by the Nebraska Department of Education. Millard West is also accredited by the North Central Association of Schools and Colleges.

School Information:

Millard West opened in August 1995 to serve the rapidly growing western area of the district. Millard West is proud to have been recognized in 2002 by the U.S. Dept. of Education as a National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence. For the last four years, Millard West has been recognized by *The Washington Post* as one of America's Most Challenging High Schools.

Millard West operates on a four by four semester block schedule with four grading periods each year. Credits are assigned to classes at five (5) credits per course per semester. Class periods are 90 minutes in length.

Millard Public Schools offers four Career Academies for high school students. Students can apply for a two-year program in Business & Logistics Management, Education, Entrepreneurship, Health Science Academies during their sophomore year.

Faculty:

Of the 144 certified teaching staff, 75% have masters or higher degrees. Student/teacher ratio is 17/1; student/counselor ratio is 361/1.

Graduation Requirements:

Students must earn a minimum of 230 credits in order to graduate from Millard West High School. The subject areas and the minimum number of credits a student must earn in each area are listed below:

In addition to course requirements, graduates 2016 & beyond must meet the Essential Learner Outcomes of College and Career Readiness metric as measured by the ACT assessment. The ACT® assessment is given to all Millard juniors during the regular school day. Students also complete a Personal Learning Plan (PLP).

Marking System:

1 = A = 93—100%	= 20 mark points
2 = B = 85—92%	= 15 mark points
3 = C = 77—84%	= 10 mark points
4 = D = 69—76%	= 5 mark points
5 = F = 0—68%	= 0 mark points

Class Rank & Grade Point Average:

Class rank is determined by using the cumulative grade point average of all classes beginning with ninth grade and multiplying it by the total mark points a student receives. Note, the more courses a student takes, the more apt his/her rank is to be higher. AP courses are weighted and receive an extra five mark points for the top three grades. Each student's cumulative GPA and class rank are printed in the upper left hand corner of the transcript. Beginning with the Class of 2020, a Laude Recognition Model will be used to recognize student achievement.
